



General Description

The FDMS8672S has been designed to minimize losses in power conversion application. Advancements in both silicon and package technologies have been combined to offer the lowest $r_{DS(on)}$ while maintaining excellent switching performance. This device has the added benefit of an efficient monolithic Schottky body diode.




Figure 1. On Region Characteristics




Figure 2. Normalized On-Resistance vs Drain Current and Gate Voltage




Figure 3. Normalized On Resistance vs Junction Temperature




Figure 4. On-Resistance vs Gate to Source Voltage




Figure 5. Transfer Characteristics




Figure 6. Source to Drain Diode Forward Voltage vs Source Current




Figure 7. Gate Charge Characteristics




Figure 8. Capacitance vs Drain to Source Voltage




Figure 9. Unclamped Inductive Switching Capability




Figure 10. Maximum Continuous Drain Current vs Case Temperature




Figure 11. Forward Bias Safe Operating Area




Figure 12. Single Pulse Maximum Power Dissipation




Figure 13. Transient Thermal Response Curve

SyncFET Schottky body diode Characteristics




Figure 14. FDMS8672S SyncFET Body Diode Reverse Recovery Characteristics

Fairchild's SyncFET process embeds a Schottky diode in parallel with PowerTrench MoSFET. This diode exhibits similar characteristics to a discrete external Schottky diode in parallel with a MOSFET. Figure 14 shows the reverse recovery characteristic of the FDMS8672S.

Schottky barrier diodes exhibit significant leakage at high temperature and high reverse voltage. This will increase the power in the device.





Figure 15. SyncFET Body Diode Reverse Leakage vs Drain to Source Voltage
